I commend your attempts to put clarity and certainty into the concept of charities and public benevolent institutions.

Like many other organisations, however, I am concerned about the attempt to fetter not for profit organisations from speaking out on social issues. I understand that the not for profit sector receives monies from various levels of government and accepts these principally in return for the delivery of services. It is not unexpected therefore that the funding body (government) does not take well to being criticised for various policies. Nevertheless, I feel we will be a poorer society if organisations do not continue to have an advocacy role independent of government.

I agree with ACOSS' proposal that government should "recognise that charities may engage in non-partisan advocacy that is an integral part of a strategy to promote an

underlying dominant charitable purpose, such as relieving poverty or protecting the environment.

I also agree with ACOSS that PBIs need to be given greater attention in the legislation and that a Charities COmmission be appointed as watchdog to ensure the probity and integrity of the sector.
